PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR MATCHING PAIRS OHP GAME

A. TO PRINT THE COVERSHEET

- The coversheet should be of light card, which should pass through an ink jet or bubble jet printer with little problem. You may need to reset the paper thickness setting on the printer
- Make sure your printer is set to the A4 page size
- Set printer to BLACK
- The resolution setting could be set at PHOTO QUALITY but this is not necessary. The next setting down should be fine

B. TO PRINT THE ACETATE SHEETS

- The game sheets should be of the acetate sheet type compatible with your printer
- Make sure to insert the sheet into the printer the correct side up
- Set the printer to A4
- Set the resolution to PHOTO QUALITY and the material type to TRANSPARENCES
 - C. ATTACHING COVERSHEET TO AN ACETATE SHEET
- Use a FOLD BACK bulldog type clip to hold the acetate sheet to the back of the coversheet (Note all sheets have alignment marks at each corner)

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MATCHING PAIRS

MATCHING PAIRS:

- a. Construction
- Cut around the hinged flaps of the twelve boxes of the **cover sheet**; be sure to remove the black triangles on the bottom left corners and to cut out the numbers in each box.
- Glue or tape the cover sheet over the transparency.
- b. Play
- Matching Pairs is not a team game. Students compete individually by taking turns to request the lifting of pairs of box flaps.
- There are at least Two Ways to Play:
- i. Students take turns to request a numbered box and asked to *name the picture* and to only be allowed to choose a second box if they answer the first *correctly*. If the boxes match and the student identifies the second box correctly the student earns one point and has a second turn. If answered *incorrectly* the teacher names the boxes and *closes the flaps*.
- ii. Students request *two* numbered boxes; the teacher turns these *open*. If the boxes match the student earns one point; *in addition* a student earns *one additional point* for *each* box identified and has a second turn. If they do *not match* both boxes are identified by the teacher and *both are closed*.
