PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR Mesolithic Village

1. To Print the Black & White model

Make sure your printer is set to the A4 page size

Set printer to BLACK

Set printer to *high resolution* e.g. *Photo setting* if you are using the print-out as masters for duplication

Print pages 1 on WHITE light cover-board at least 180 gsm in weight

Print Base (page 1) on buff or brown

If **PAINTING** the model be sure to do so before assembly and **MAKE SURE NOT TO GET THE MODEL TOO WET. LET model DRY THOROUGHLY** before assembly.

2. To Print the colour model

Make sure your printer is set to the A4 page size

Set printer to **COLOUR**

Set printer to *high resolution* i.e. *Photo setting*

Print pages 1 & 2 on **WHITE** light cover-board at least 180 gsm in weight.

CONSTRUCTION INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Tools** needed: cutting board, newspaper, cutting knife, scissors, ruler,

glue stick such as UHU, clothes pegs (for clamps)

2. Cut out the circle of hut A on Page 2.

2. Cut out wall of Hut A. Use a glue stick to glue the end tab inside the wall to form a ring. Hold till dry.

3. Fold the Bottom TABS of Hut A **OUTWARDS** at 90°. Fold the top TABS of Hut A **INWARDS** at approximately 45°.

4. Cut out the Roof of Hut A. Form into a **CONE** gluing the tab under the roof. Hold till dry.

DO NOT GLUE THE ROOF TO THE top of the WALLS YET!!

5. Turn page 2 upside down and run the glue stick around the edge of the hole for the hut A and insert the hut

MAKING SURE THE DOOR ALIGNS WITH THE PATH ON Page 2 (the Base)

REPEAT STEPS 2 to 5 for the slightly larger Hut B and the largest hut C.

6. With the model correct side up on a firm surface Press the base around the outside of the huts' wall firmly till dry.

7. When the walls of the huts are dry run the glue stick around the **triangular tabs on the TOPS of the walls.**

Carefully position the roofs **centrally** over the walls making sure the triangular tabs bend inwards and hold down firmly until dry.


8 If desired, glue the model to a piece of card the size of the base to strengthen your model

9. If you colour printed your model you may wish to spray with clear lacquer to protect the surface against moisture.


10. Decorate the base with modelling grass and trees if you wish.

11. To make a larger village mount two models long side-by-long side with one model rotated 180°.




